### EPA Settlements Around Supplemental Registrations Emphasis on Distributor Labels

On April 20th the EPA announced three settlements with basic registrants which stemmed from a case against Harrell's LLC of Lakeland, FL. The cases involved supplemental distributor product labels "which lacked"

### CDPR Finalized Increase to Registration Fees

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On April 16, 2015, the California Department of Pesticide Regulation (CDPR) announced that after consideration they will be increasing pesticide registration fees. Effective October 1, 2015, CDPR is increasing the product registration/renewal fee from \$750.00 per product to \$1,150.00 per product. There will also be a change in the application fee for amendments. All amendments, no matter the type, will have a \$25.00 fee. The official notice can be found at:

# OSHA HazCom Deadline Looms June 1st Fast Approaching

For manufacturers and importers, approximately 30 days remains to get your Safety Data Sheets (SDSs) and labels compliant with the OSHA HazCom 2012 Standard. Beginning on June 1<sup>st</sup>;

- 1. All chemicals must be evaluated for their hazards.
- 2. All Safety Data Sheets must be updated to a sixteen point format containing the required information.
- 3. All labels for products with classified hazards must be updated and used in new production.
